Course Content	This subject is available at Levels 2 and 3 only. The programme is designed to give a broad understanding of classical Greek and Roman civilisations not only for their own sake but also to appreciate the link between classical ideas and values and the contemporary world. The topics covered in Year 12 and Year 13 involve the study of history, mythology and religion, culture and literature in both Greece and Rome. The course provides a varied programme and the opportunity to develop research, analytical and communication skills.	
Prerequisites	Students should have achieved a minimum of 10 Level 1 credits in English or History. Any student not meeting these recommendations may be allowed entry at the discretion of the Head of Department.	Students should have achieved a minimum of 10 Level 2 credits in English or History. Any student not meeting these recommendations may be allowed entry at the discretion of the Head of Department
Assessment	There are 18 compulsory credits available from four Achievement Standards. Two of these standards, worth ten credits, are internally assessed.	There are up to 22 credits available from four Achievement Standards. Two of these standards, worth twelve credits, are internally assessed.
