Course Content	Learn a wide range of performance skills in a repertoire of dance genres. Students explore choreographic processes, extending their choreographic skills through the making of group and solo dances. They develop ideas and manipulate choreographic tools to communicate intention and emotion. Students study a professional dance performance and explain how ideas are communicated through dance elements, devices, and technologies. Students learn to provide evidence to support an argument. Or Students will demonstrate understanding of a dance genre or style in context with supporting evidence.
